Tsinghua University Established on the former imperial gardens of the Qing Dynasty in northwestern Beijing in 1911, Tsinghua University is a comprehensive university widely recognized for excellence in teaching and research. It is consistently ranked among the top institutions in international rankings, with particular strengths in the fields of science, engineering, management, and the humanities. The Tsinghua campus is famous for its beautiful gardens, shady trees, and diverse architecture.
