Study abroad in the home of UCEAP's first exchange program. Located in the southwest of France, the city of Bordeaux is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, full of art, culture, and history with elegant 18th-century architecture. It is an ethnically diverse city featuring a lively student culture. Programs begin with a mandatory 2-week intensive language program for academic credit designed to advance French language skills and acquaint students with French academic culture.
