About Cyprus and Nicosia

- #1 safest country in the world for students. #1 European small city for lifestyle and education (beating Oxford and Geneva).
- The perfect combination of Mediterranean lifestyle and cosmopolitan business hub.
- A small island with a long history, Cyprus provides a unique setting to experience a confluence of cultures, both ancient and modern. Ancient Greeks, Egyptians, and Romans along with Crusaders, Byzantines, Franks, Ottomans, and British have all left their mark on the island.
- English is widely spoken due to former British colonial rule, although Greek and Turkish are the two official languages.
- Cyprus is currently European tourists' destination of choice, and budget airlines make it easy to travel to Europe and beyond.

Requirements

- 2.85 cumulative GPA at the time of application and maintained through departure
- Sophomore, Junior, or Senior

When

- Fall quarter: mid-September to mid-December
- Spring semester: mid-January to late May

Coursework

Take 16 UC quarter units in fall quarter, or 22.5 UC quarter units in spring semester, (winter + spring quarters) with local and international students. All courses are taught in English by faculty professors in a wide variety of subjects in the arts, humanities, social sciences, and STEM.

Strong subjects include, but are not limited to: Accounting & Finance, Architecture, Art, Biology, Blockchain/Cryptocurrency (#1 in the world), Business, Communication, Dance, Economics, Engineering, Film & Media Studies (see Comm), Health Sciences, International Relations, Law, Marketing, Middle Eastern Studies, Music, Political Science, and Psychology.

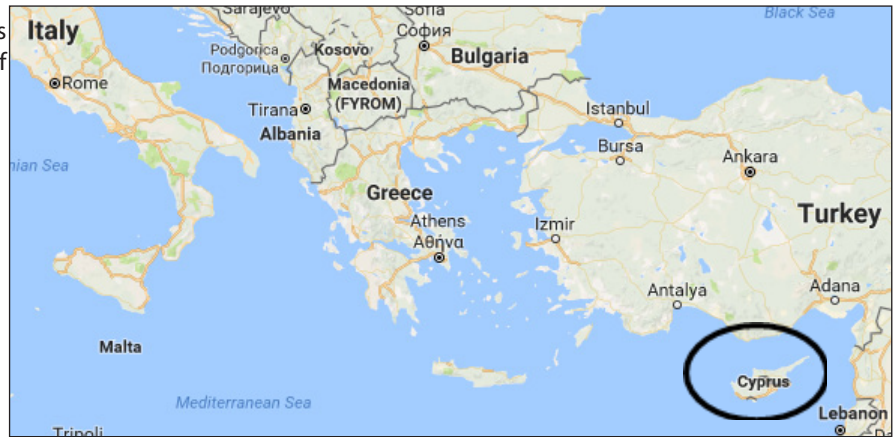
Internships, lab research, field research, and independent study are possible.

Housing

Live with other international students in university apartments located in residential areas near campus.

Activities

Participate in a series of educational trips and cultural excursions within Cyprus. Destinations include the southern coastal cities of Larnaca, Limassol, and Paphos as well as the Troodos Mountains and Northern Cyprus. Additionally, the university plans a wide variety of events for international students, and sports, clubs, and student organizations are also open to you.
