Requirements

- 2.50 cumulative GPA at the time of application and maintained through departure
- Sophomore, Junior, or Senior

When

- Fall: late August to mid-December
- Spring: late January to mid-May
- Year: late August to mid-May

Coursework

You will take 22.5-27 UC quarter units, 5-6 classes per semester with US and international students. All courses are taught in English.

At least three courses must be taken at the CIEE Study Center with other US students. You will also have the option of taking courses for international students at Charles University or at the Film and Television School of the Academy of the Performing Arts (FAMU), or pursuing an internship for credit.

Course Subject Areas: Anthropology, Art History, Communication, Central European Studies, Czech Language, Drama, Economics, Film & Media Studies, History, Literature, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Religious Studies, Slavic Studies, Sociology.

Program Highlights

- Internship and volunteering opportunities in public and private-sector organizations, NGOs, museums, film festivals, and schools.
- Join an extracurricular interest group or the International Students Club with Czech students. Interest group topics include politics, economy, society, sports, film and theater, music, and art.
- The program includes visits to sites of historical and cultural importance in Prague, as well as field trips to locations in Bohemia and Moravia. Optional guided field trips to cities in surrounding countries are also available at additional cost.

Housing Options

- Single room in a homestay with a Czech family; breakfasts & dinners included.
- Single or double room in an apartment style CIEE residence hall with other American students. Czech student Resident Assistants live separately.
- Double room in an apartment arranged by CIEE with American students and one Czech "flat buddy". Some singles may be available.

Scholarships

- After you submit your UCEAP application you will be asked to complete a CIEE application, which contains these CIEE scholarship applications:
 - CIEE Global Access Initiative (GAIN) Grants- up to \$2,000. **Guaranteed** for all Pell-eligible applicants on a first-come, first-served basis.
 - CIEE Gilman Go Global Grants- \$2,500 for semester or year, \$1,000 for summer programs. **Guaranteed** for all qualified Gilman International Scholarship applicants regardless of whether they are awarded a Gilman. Plus, Go Global Grant recipients are guaranteed a GAIN Grant, too!
 - CIEE Merit Scholarships- \$2,500 for semester or year, \$750 for summer.
