Coursework	<p>This program offers intensive Chinese language study from beginning to advanced levels through the Mandarin Training Center (MTC). Language courses are taught in Chinese with traditional (complex) Mandarin characters and pinyin spelling. Classes often use audio-visual and computer multimedia to keep instruction dynamic. Advanced courses utilize Chinese newspaper reading, radio, and television programs. MTC also offers courses incorporating classical, historical, and philosophical texts.</p>	<p>Courses in select fields taught in English or, for students proficient in Chinese, a full range of courses taught in Chinese. Your curriculum will depend on your major and your Chinese language ability.</p> <p>If your major is in engineering, economics, or management, these fields have particularly strong coursework taught in English and you should be able to find sufficient coursework for full-time study.</p> <p>All other majors will probably need to take courses taught in English as well as Chinese language study in order to meet minimum UC unit requirements.</p> <p>If you have native or near-native Chinese language ability, you will be able to take courses from the university's offerings taught in Chinese.</p> <p>Chinese language study from beginning to advanced levels is available.</p> <p>All NTU courses taught in Chinese or providing Chinese language study use traditional Chinese (complex) characters.</p>

This summer program is held in state-of-the-art labs under the expert direction of faculty and graduate students.**

Coursework	<p>Students take two required courses in this program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lab Research • Exploring Taiwan <p>Modern, well-equipped departmental labs include those in the College of Science, College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, College of Engineering, College of Bio Resources and Agriculture, College of Life Science, College of Public Health, and School of Veterinary Medicine. Time in the lab is estimated to be 30 or more hours per week, including weekly team meetings, with some variability based on the project and lab team to which a student is assigned.</p> <p>The Exploring Taiwan course offers a series of lectures, cultural activities, and excursions to look at Taiwan's geography, society, and culture.</p>

National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU) Located in the cultural hub of Taipei, the NTNU Mandarin Training Center (MTC) was founded in 1956 to teach Chinese as a second language. With 1,700 students from over 70 countries enrolled each term, MTC facilities include over 70 classrooms, a library, two language labs, computer rooms, a multi-media classroom, an auditorium, and a student lounge. MTC organizes activities throughout each term, such as speech competitions, a Dragon Boat race, and cultural excursions.

National Taiwan University (NTU) Located in the heart of Taipei, NTU is the country's oldest and most comprehensive university. NTU, known locally as Taida, is one of the top-ranked institutions in Asia and is considered one of the top 100 research universities worldwide. With coursework taught in English and Chinese in a wide range of fields, the curriculum is rigorous. Admission for locals is gained through a highly competitive exam, so acceptance to NTU is considered a major accomplishment. A strong network of influential social, business, academic, and political leaders, within and beyond Taiwan, hold degrees from NTU. The park-like NTU campus is surrounded by lively shops and restaurants and is easily accessible to downtown Taipei via subway or public bus.
