Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2.85 cumulative GPA at the time of application and maintained through departure • Soph, Jr, Sr, or Grad • All male citizens between the ages of 18 and 36 who were born in Taiwan or who have ever held a Taiwan passport are subject to compulsory military training by the Taiwanese government. This policy applies to dual citizens, even if entering Taiwan on a non-Taiwanese passport. You may be required to submit additional paperwork. Coursework	<p>Coursework designed for students of all levels, beginning or advanced, who want to learn Chinese. Students enroll in two required courses:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Chinese Language: The curriculum provides opportunities for interaction and improving communication abilities. It includes different themes that tie together the daily language class, cultural activities, and interactions with locals. 2) Exploring Taiwan: This course offers a series of lectures and field trips that allow students to explore specific environmental and sociocultural aspects of Taiwan. 	<p>Coursework taught in English related to business, economics, engineering, and political science, or Asian studies courses designed for international students.</p> <p>Students with native or near-native Chinese language ability may take courses from a broad range of offerings taught in Chinese.</p> <p>Chinese language study available from beginning to advanced levels.</p> <p>All courses taught in Chinese as well as Chinese language classes use traditional Chinese (complex) characters.</p>	<p>Students enroll in two required courses:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Lab Research: Lab time is generally 30 or more hours per week, including weekly team meetings.
