Coursework	<p>Students take two courses in this program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encountering Vietnam - Each lecture involves some preparatory reading, a trip to a place, meetings with people there, and discussion. This course also includes the language component. This course has an interdisciplinary focus and is offered under history, anthropology, and South and Southeast Asian studies. • Independent Special Study - This course focuses on experiential learning and brings UC students together with local students to work together in creating a short travel documentary film. No prior film-making experience needed! The primary intellectual goal is for students to integrate methods of research, interviewing - oral history, storytelling, travel narrative - into an entertaining short film.
