Coursework	<p>Students enroll in three courses:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Southeast Asian Language & Culture - Basics of Thai and Burmese language and culture 2) Mobility & Border Health - Concepts taught in the classroom introduce challenges facing migrants, the complex and dynamic reasons for migration, and the effects of globalization across geopolitical borders. 3) Health Realities in Border Populations - The course takes an interactive approach to learning about border health issues and offers the chance to observe, interact, and problem-solve with migrant community members and stakeholders. <p>See here for details about the program, course schedule, and activities.</p>	<p>This eight-week full-time internship program includes two courses:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Internship/Community-Based Learning: Acquire internship work hours along with meetings and assignments organized and managed by a Thammasat University internship coordinator. 2) Global Academic Immersion: This interdisciplinary course teaches you integrated skills that instill an understanding of global citizenship. It includes a series of lectures and workshops on Thai organizational structures and culture.
