45 Years Ago

It was the fall of 1977 and Joanne Pon, a junior at UC Santa Barbara at the time, had made a life-changing decision to apply to the UCSB Education Abroad Program. At the same time, 136 miles south of UCSB, in Irvine, Barry Rubin, also a junior enrolled at UC Irvine, had made the same, life-changing decision...to spend a year abroad in the United Kingdom with the UCEAP.

Neither Joanne nor Barry knew it at the time, but their desire to travel, to leave the comfort of their Southern California communities, and to expand their horizons. and "see the world," would alter the direction of their lives forever. The impact of that decision to enroll in EAP would truly affect their lives for decades to come, well beyond the 1977-78 academic year in which they lived and studied at the University of Birmingham campus located in the suburb of Edgbaston, in

Meet Amy B. - Spain Fall 2021 Returnee





Earlier this winter quarter, UCSB EAP welcomed 104 new reciprocal exchange students from 15 countries. They are


