



Highlights	<ul> <li>Cape Town is an ideal location for global learning, international connections, and understanding different views on common issues</li> <li>UCT is considered the top university in Africa and nearly 20 percent of the student population is international, from over 110 countries</li> <li>Research, service learning, and volunteer opportunities are available. Many students participate in community service projects in education, law, or public health with a student-run service organization.</li> </ul>	Participate in a full-time, eight-week summer internship in Cape Town  Orientations, networking events, and meetings with internship supervisors are held at the study center and local organizations
