Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK): Established in 1963 as a comprehensive university with a distinctly Chinese character and curriculum, CUHK is committed to bilingualism, biculturalism, and the importance of providing an international study experience. One of Asia's top research-intensive universities, CUHK is located 45 minutes from downtown Hong Kong in Shatin in the New Territories. The multicultural campus is a peaceful refuge from the bustling city and serves as a home base in which you can study and from which you can explore Asia. CUHK is recommended for students interested in learning Chinese (Mandarin and/or Cantonese).
