



Coursework	12 UC quarter units; 2 classes  The courses on this program fulfill UCSB Chemistry 109 A-B and 6 AL.  This is an intensive program. Prepare to be in classes at University College Dublin all day Monday-Friday, and reserve travel for the weekends or after the program ends. You'll be in classes with other UC students only.  The program includes 2 full-day excursions, walking tour of Dublin, Irish music & dancing, movie nights, sports matches, Fourth of July celebration, welcome and farewell dinners and events, gym and pool access.	21 UC quarter units; 3 classes plus the internship.  Starting Week 2, you will spend 15-20 hours per week at your internship in Parliament in Dublin. Based on your skills and past experience, you may be assigned research, report writing, drafting of press releases, and/or corresponding with constituents or organizations on local matters. The internship is arranged for you.  You will also be enrolled in three upper-division courses which are taken at the Institute of Public Administration with other US students: Irish Society & Politics (intensive course that runs just Week 1), Modern Irish History, and Modern Irish Literature.
Housing	You will stay in on-campus housing, in suites of 4 private bedrooms and a shared bathroom and kitchen. The suites and linens are cleaned weekly. A meal plan is included Monday-Friday.	You will participate in a homestay with a local Irish family in Dublin. Breakfast and dinner will be provided during the week, and on weekends you will receive lunch, but not breakfast and dinner. Homestays are integral to the program and are required for all participants.
