


## TAIWAN

Coursework	Coursework designed for students of all levels. Students enroll in two required courses:  1) Chinese Language: The curriculum provides opportunities for interaction and improving communication abilities. It includes different themes that tie together the daily language class, cultural activities, and interactions with locals.  2) Exploring Taiwan: This course offers a series of lectures and field trips that allow students to explore specific environmental and sociocultural aspects of Taiwan.  All courses taught in Chinese as well as Chinese language classes use traditional Chinese (complex) characters.	Coursework taught in English related to business, economics, engineering, and political science, or Asian studies courses designed for international students.  Students with native or near-native Chinese language ability may take courses from a broad range of offerings taught in Chinese.  Chinese language study available from beginning to advanced levels.  All courses taught in Chinese as well as Chinese language classes use traditional Chinese (complex) characters.	Students enroll in two required courses:  1) Lab Research: Lab time is generally 30 or more hours per week, including weekly team meetings. The time commitment varies depending on the project and your assigned lab team.  2) Exploring Taiwan: This course offers a series of lectures, cultural activities, and excursions to look at Taiwan's geography, society, and culture.
