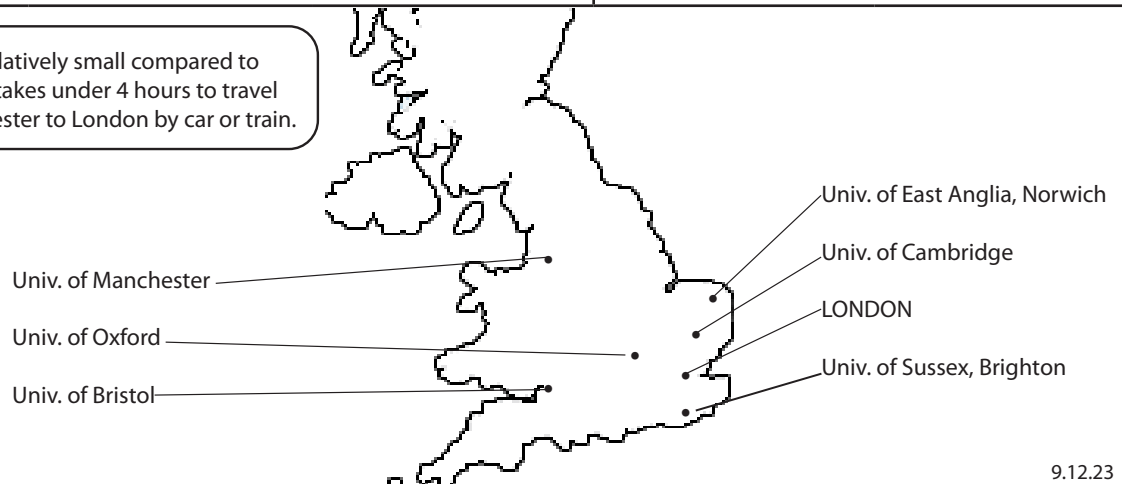
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Fully immerse yourself in British culture by attending a host university in England and taking classes in your major. You will attend classes and live alongside local UK and international students. **Research** is commonly built into higher level courses, and independent study is possible. **Internships** may be possible for year-long students, but must be arranged independently. Semester students may be able to intern but only in the rare situation that they have a guaranteed placement arranged months in advance; please contact the EAP advisor.

How Much Will it Really Cost? If you are not already planning on taking summer classes, summer UCEAP costs will add significantly to your existing yearly academic costs. Please contact the UCSB Financial Aid Office at FinAidEAP@sa.ucsb.edu to request an estimate of your financial aid on a particular UCEAP summer program. Typically, you can only use whatever financial aid you have left after the academic year for summer programs, whereas if you go abroad during the academic year, UCEAP costs substitute the cost of staying at UCSB and your financial aid is guaranteed to travel with you. There are also fewer scholarships available in summer. Please contact your EAP advisor for more information about program costs, scholarships, or how to fit a semester or year abroad into your existing graduation timeline.

How Much Will it Really Cost? If you are not already planning on taking summer classes, summer UCEAP costs will add significantly to your existing yearly academic costs. Please contact the UCSB Financial Aid Office at FinAidEAP@sa.ucsb.edu to request an estimate of your financial aid on a particular UCEAP program. Typically, you can only use whatever financial aid you have left after the academic year for summer programs, whereas if you go abroad during the fall, spring, or year, UCEAP costs substitute the cost of staying at UCSB and your financial aid is guaranteed to travel with you. There are also fewer scholarships available in summer. Please contact your EAP advisor for more information about program costs, scholarships, or how to fit a semester or year abroad into your existing graduation timeline.

The table below is not an exhaustive listing of subject areas available at host institutions in England. Instead, it provides preliminary guidance on what historically has been available. We recommend you check each host university's study abroad course page to see what is available to you as it can change from year to year. Keep in mind that there may be courses that cover a particular subject area but are based in a different department (e.g. Women's Studies courses in Sociology). **It is essential that you heed any restrictions outlined below.** For University College London and King's College London in particular, there are several restrictions in the subject areas available to study abroad students.

UK second-year courses are usually considered "equivalent" to the junior year at a US university. This is important as some host universities have restrictions regarding the level of courses available to study abroad students.

General subject area restrictions across all host institutions:

- Courses in **science, math, and engineering** may be limited for Fall-only options. Please check with the individual university if alternative assessment is available.
- Most **law** courses at U.K. host universities are year-long courses only. If you are a semester student and you want to take law courses, you can do so at the University of Manchester, the University of London, Royal Holloway, the University of Sussex, and on a case-by-case basis at the University of Kent.
- There are no courses in **medicine** open to UCEAP students in England.

King's College London (KCL)

King's offers placements for Fall, Spring, and Year-Long programmes. Module availability can change from year to year, and the list of available classes is usually not available until the summer, often immediately before departure for fall and year students. Because of this, students who need to take specific courses abroad to fulfil strict major or minor requirements should consider an alternative host institution.

King's College London offers a very limited number of introductory classes, and it admits students only in courses/departments that have substantial course availability. Students can wish to study only in the subject areas in which they already have a strong academic background.

The table above lists suitable majors at King's College London, and KCL can offer students access to classes in that area. If students want to study subjects outside of their major, they must already have taken a minimum of 3-4 classes in that subject area to have access to 2nd-year classes at KCL; or 5-6 classes to have access to 3rd-year classes at KCL. These restrictions cannot be waived.

Places on modules are not guaranteed for any student due to class size restrictions and are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

Module registration is competitive across all departments except Economics, Business, Philosophy, Chemistry, Physics, Maths, Law, and Biosciences.

The following majors are **not** suitable for application to KCL, either because they are not taught, don't have sufficient capacity, or are unavailable to study abroad students.

- Computer Science
- Psychology (unless coming for the year)
- Neuroscience / cognitive science
- Media studies
- Mechanical Engineering
- Creative Writing
- Film Studies
- Communications
- Art & Art History
- Health & Society

Additional caveats and restrictions

Music - you can only take Music classes if you play an instrument and can read music fluently.

Women's/Gender Studies – no dedicated department or course, but classes can be taken in English, Comparative Literature, French, etc. Students will need to meet eligibility criteria of those departments.

Psychology - Students wishing to take modules within the Department of Psychology must be FULL-YEAR students and take either the full suite of Level 4 (first year) or Level 5 (second year) modules, dependent on prior academic experience. A member of academic staff within Psychology will review your university transcript to assess which level you should study at but typically, students with little or no Psychology background will take Level 4 modules, and students with at least one full year of Psychology on their transcript will take Level 5. At Level 4, students must take 8 compulsory Psychology modules, and at Level 5, must take 6 compulsory Psychology modules, with a free choice of two modules from other faculties and departments across King's.

Biosciences - With a few exceptions, course availability is very good in the biosciences. However, courses may take place across a whole day; do not chose multiple courses on the same day.

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Queen Mary University of London

Students can study at Queen Mary in the Fall, Spring, or the full Year. Before arriving in the UK, students must pre-register for classes, and are advised to register for double the amount they need in order to avoid missing classes. Classes can still be added or dropped after term begins. On the module directory page, UCEAP students can take any classes listed as 'available to Associate students'.

Caveats and restrictions

In general, students cannot take Level 7 classes, as these are for postgraduates. However, some Level 7 classes are available in the schools of Engineering, Computer Science, and Material Science if the prerequisites are met.

Economics and Finance - all Level 5 and 6 classes are for Economics/Finance majors only. Students in other majors will be considered if all prerequisites are met. For all Level 4 classes, the equivalent of A-Level Maths is required.

English - Level 5 and 6 classes are open to majors in Arts/Social Science/Humanities only.

Drama - Level 5 and 6 classes require experience of related subjects at university level. Practice-based classes are reserved for Drama majors only.

Geography - some Level 7 classes are available to UCEAP students, decided on a case-by-case basis.

Physics - students wishing to take Physics classes must email the Study Abroad office with their AP or IB subjects and marks in Physics and Math.

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University of Sussex

Sussex offers placements in Fall, Spring, and the Full Year. Students are generally free to take whichever courses they like, but there are some restrictions, and some majors are called different names.

Caveats and Restrictions

Business Administration – Called Business, Management and Marketing at Sussex. Students wishing to take certain classes must have prior experience in the subject.

Communication – no Communication department, but classes are available in Media, Film and Communication

Earth & Space Sciences – no dedicated department, but classes are available in Geography, Physics, and Astronomy

Economics – For some classes, students have to be able to be on campus to sit unseen exams at the end of term. Some classes also are only available to Year students who have prior knowledge of the subject.

Engineering – Department is called Engineering & Design.

English/ Dramatic Arts – English and Drama are one department at Sussex.

Film & Media Studies – called Media, Film, and Communication. Students wishing to take Media Production classes should be aware there are very few spaces, and that there are pre-requisites for level 5 and 6 classes, and students must be taking a major at home that requires Media Production classes to be considered.

Geography – Students wishing to take the Southeast England Field class in semester 2 will need to enrol in person.

International Studies – no dedicated department, but students can take classes in International Development and International Relations.

Legal Studies – called Law at Sussex. Students must take the Law of Contract class if they wish to take the Commercial Law class (runs in both semesters)

UCL offers placements in Fall, Spring, and the full Year. At UCL, students must be based in a home department, where you will take at least 50% of your classes. Home departments:

^ Refer to the **Economics** department's strict [entry requirements](#) before applying. This includes a minimum GPA of 3.5 and prerequisite classes.

^ **Biology:** The department of biological sciences base department requires a minimum GPA of 3.5.

^ **Political Science:** The department of political science base department requires a minimum GPA of 3.5.

^ **Liberal Arts and Sciences** operates like a separate department, but it uses modules provided by other departments to form its program of study. The department also offers [its own modules](#). Spring term only students must take one BAsC-coded module and one other module from the Arts and Sciences offerings.

^ **Natural Sciences** at UCL is an interdisciplinary field that is covered by the departments of:

- Chemistry
- Biological Sciences
- Physics
- Earth Sciences
- Statistical Science

For Natural Sciences, you need to search for available classes under the discipline-specific module catalogs from the study abroad catalog (see link below).

For all home departments except *Liberal Arts and Sciences*, you must have prior experience in the subject (usually it will match up to your major). Apart from your 50% of classes in your home department, you can take classes in a wide range of subjects listed in the study abroad catalog. All courses are subject to availability.

Caveats and restrictions

If you wish to take classes in Economics but it is not your home department, and you have a GPA below 3.5, you can only take Economics classes listed in the [Elective Module Portfolio](#). If you're interested in Year 2 or 3 Economics courses, the economics department advises you to apply to the department.

Courses taught outside of the home departments listed above are not covered by the study abroad exchange, and so UCL cannot guarantee access to classes in these courses. If you want to take classes outside of your home department, you will need to approach the department you want to take classes in to discuss availability. The Admissions Tutor will decide this on a case-by-case basis.

Music – some classes require knowledge of how to read sheet music.

Sociology – students must take both classes: Sociology Project and Sociology Research Proposal

Women's/Gender Studies – no dedicated department, relevant classes are available in History, Sociology, Politics etc.
